Tracy Boulian

joined the newspaper two years ago and is the newest member of The Plain Dealer photography staff. Before coming to Cleveland, she worked at the Naples Daily News in south Florida. Originally from Connecticut, Tracy is a 2005 graduate of the Tisch School of the Arts at New York University where she studied photography, anthropology and sociology. She was an intern at The Plain Dealer in 2005.

Gus Chan

has worked in his native Cleveland for the past 18 years. During that time his greatest enjoyment has come from documenting life in his hometown. Gus is a past winner of the Associated Press Society of Ohio best photographer award and was runner-up in 2008. Along with reporter Rachel Dissell, Gus also won the Columbia University Dart Award for Excellence in Coverage of Trauma for the series "Johanna: Facing Forward."

Chuck Crow

has been with The Plain Dealer since 1995. In addition to general assignment photography, Chuck has covered the Cleveland Indians for the past nine years and is recognized as one of the best baseball photographers in the country. He is a graduate of Miami University and lives in Mentor, Ohio, with his wife, Terry, and their children Catherine and Max.

Lisa DeJong

has been a staff photographer for The Plain Dealer since 2007. She also has worked at the Flint Journal and Muskegon Chronicle in Michigan and the St. Petersburg Times in Florida. Her 2008 portfolio earned Lisa photographer of the year honors by the Ohio News Photographers Association and also the Associated Press Society of Ohio best photographer award. Her work with reporter Joanna Connors on the series "Beyond Rape: A Survivor's Journey," won first place for photo story in the Pictures of the Year International annual contest in 2009. In addition, Lisa and Joanna won the Columbia University Dart Award for Excellence in Coverage of Trauma for the series.

Marvin Fong

is a native of northern California and came to work in Ohio in 1994 as an intern and staff photographer for the Dayton Daily News. He has been with The Plain Dealer for the past 11 years. Marvin has a bachelor's degree in media communications from California State University of Sacramento.

Joshua Gunter

is a native of Indiana and graduated from Ball State University in 2000 with a degree in photojournalism and graphic journalism. After completing an internship at The Plain Dealer in the summer of 2000, he was hired as a staff photographer in 2002. Josh resides in Lakewood with his wife, Heather, and son, Reid.

Lynn Ischay

has been a photojournalist for more than 30 years, working as a general assignment photographer at various publications throughout Ohio. She was a stringer for United Press International and The Cleveland Press and a staff photographer for the News Herald and the Columbus Dispatch. A native of Cleveland, Lynn has been with The Plain Dealer for 11 years.

John Kuntz

has been Ohio Photographer of the Year twice in the past five years. He began his photojournalism career in Cleveland as a freelancer and worked for Reuters in Atlanta for eight years before coming to The Plain Dealer in 1998. He has covered a variety of news and sporting events including hurricanes, the Oklahoma City bombing, several World Series, NBA Finals, Super Bowls, both the summer and winter Olympics and The Final Four.

Thomas Ondrey

is a native Clevelander and has been a staff photographer at The Plain Dealer since 2004. He has worked for newspapers in Pittsburgh, Stamford, Conn., Biddeford, Maine, and Kettering, Ohio. Tom is a graduate of Harvard College and also attended the masters in journalism program at Ohio University. In addition to his photography, Tom paints Ohio landscapes in watercolors and pastels.

Scott Shaw

won the Pulitzer Prize for Spot News Photography in 1988 for a photograph of Jessica McClure being rescued after 58 hours of being trapped in an abandoned oil well. Scott was working at the Odessa American in Texas at the time. The Illinois native has been a photographer at The Plain Dealer since 1990.

Lonnie Timmons III

became a professional photographer after studying art in Italy. After freelancing for several years, he was hired by the Miami Herald, where he worked for four years. A native of Baltimore, Lonnie has been with The Plain Dealer since 1998. Lonnie also shoots video for the newspaper's web site, cleveland.com.

Peggy Turbett

joined The Plain Dealer as a picture editor in 2000 but for the past five years has added photography to her responsibilities. In addition, Peggy has turned a lifelong love of travel into a series of published articles and photo exhibitions.
