ABOUT THE EXHIBITIONS

Collaborage

In celebration of Surrealism, Heights Arts partners with No Exit New Music Ensemble to bring together groups of artists to create collaborative works that embrace chance and the inexplicable. Inspired by games and thought exercises the Surrealists used to access the unconscious mind and move beyond the 'rational' world, the featured art was created using techniques favored by the Surrealists.

In order to facilitate this project, the Heights Arts Exhibition Community Team created four "teams" of artists, each of which include a random grouping of three visual artists. Heights Arts then provided copies of *A Book of Surrealist Games* to each team, instructing them to work with 12 words or phrases provided by the Heights Writes Community Team. (These words could be anything from lines of original poetry to historical quotes, phrases lifted from the news, or conglomerations thereof.) Finally, the Heights Arts Music Community Team selected 12 pieces of music from Northeast Ohio, again randomly assigning them to the artists for their use.

The resulting twelve works of art, each the product of three visual artists, three sets of words, and three pieces of music, will be on view at Heights Arts in the *Collaborage* exhibition, from August 18 to October 15, 2023. Adding another layer of chance, every work in the show will be auctioned off — allowing guests to fully embrace the strangeness.

Spotlight: Gregory Johnson

Gregory Alan Johnson was born in 1954 and grew up in Brook Park, Ohio, a suburb of Cleveland. He began doodling as a child, a practice that his father encouraged by bringing unused forms home from work, the blank backs of which he would use for his random drawings.

His art is all about the exploration of the inner and touching people in a way that transcends words. He aims to connect on a deeper level with people of like minds because he believes art is love.



Siaara Freeman is from Cleveland Ohio, where she is the current Lake Erie Siren. She is a 2023 Room in the House fellow with Karamu House Theatre and a 2022 Catapult fellow with Cleveland Public Theater. In 2021 Siaara filmed a commercial for the Cleveland Museum of Art and participated with #TeamYellowBrickRoad for the Black Joy Experience. She is a 2021 Premier Playwright fellow recipient with Cleveland Public Theatre. Her work appears in The Journal, Josephine Quarterly, Cleveland Magazine and elsewhere. She has had multiple poems go viral and has toured both nationally and internationally. Siaara is the Curriculum Development Manager at the Center for Arts-Inspired Learning, and the artistic director for Artworks. She is the current Poet Laureate of Cleveland Heights and University Heights. When she is not working she is likely by a lake, thinking of Toni Morrison and talking to ghosts. Her first full length manuscript *Urbanshee* is available with Button Poetry.

Amy Hughes is a writer and teacher from Northeast Ohio. She holds a bachelor's in education from Kent State University and an MFA in poetry in from Florida International University, and she has taught writing to middle school, high school, and college students for more than ten years. Her work



has appeared at CAN Triennial 2022: You Are Here, in the Ekphrastasy Series of Heights Arts, and in two editions of Tigertail, A South Florida Annual. Today she is a freelance writer and editor, an active member of Literary Cleveland, and a teaching artist with Lake Erie Ink where she leads creative writing workshops for Northeast Ohio students.

Sujata Lakhe was born in India and grew up in steel-town Bhilai before immigrating to Cleveland in her early 20s. She has coauthored research papers in peer-reviewed scientific journals in the field of Molecular Biology. Looking beyond the surface, questioning dogma, observing, making a conclusion (but willing to change upon learning new information), and choosing the correct details to communicate accurately are some of the things she finds in common between the scientific process and creative writing. Her personal essays and poems can be read in Neighborhood Voices, an anthology published by Cleveland Public Library, Scene, The Blue Windmill chapbook, and Literary Cleveland Blogs. She has performed her stories and poems at the Photocentric, the Story Club Cleveland, and Gilly's Music Room. She presently lives in Chagrin Falls, OH, with her husband William G Barnard IV and her daughter Samira Reddy.



Vince Robinson has been a published poet since 1978, when his first poem was published in the Kent Quarterly. He's been a performance poet since then, having performed an original in a Mwatabu Okantah written play called *To Sing A Dark* Song. His Cleveland performance history began in 1997 when he founded a poetry series called Soul Poetry. The series continues at Larchmere Arts in the present. Vince's other series, *The Nia Coffeehouse*, began at the Cleveland Museum of Art before nesting at the Coventry Library in Cleveland Heights, as well as St. Alban's Episcopal Church. He was a member of the Cleveland Poetry Slam Team that competed in National Poetry Slam competitions in 2014 and 2015. He Published his first book of poetry, Got Words?, in 2015.
